



**THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM
SEXUAL OFFENCES**

Foreword

Children are often referred to as the "gift of God". Children are a blessing that we should cherish and nurture with love and care. Their innocence and pure hearts remind us of the importance of love, compassion, and forgiveness. We must cherish them and do everything in our power to provide them with the best possible upbringing. So, it's our duty to appreciate their presence in our lives and strive to create a better world for them to inherit. So, we have the responsibility to provide a safe and nurturing environment for our children to grow in. We must instill in them values such as honesty, kindness, respect, and empathy. In the same way it is important for children to understand the laws that govern their society, as it helps them become responsible citizens. Children who are aware of the laws that govern their society are more likely to follow them and avoid getting into trouble with the authorities. Moreover, law awareness helps children develop critical thinking skills and encourages them to question authority when necessary. It also promotes social justice by teaching children about human rights and equality.

Our Catholic educational institutions have been instrumental in promoting law awareness among students. Our institutions have a long history of emphasizing the importance of justice, morality, and ethics in society. We have instilled values such as respect for the law, human dignity, and social responsibility in our students since ages. This has helped to create a culture where students understand that laws are not arbitrary but rather reflect fundamental principles that guide our society. Our efforts to promote legal literacy among marginalized communities are commendable and reflect our commitment to creating a just society.

In this way, the POCSO Act is an essential tool in protecting the rights of children and ensuring their safety from sexual abuse.

The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act was introduced in India in 2012 to safeguard children from sexual abuse and exploitation. It is crucial for children to be aware of this act as it empowers them to speak up against any form of sexual abuse they may face. It is important for parents, teachers, and care givers to create a safe environment where children feel comfortable discussing any instances of sexual abuse they may have faced. This will help in early detection and prevention of such incidents. It is our responsibility as a society to ensure that every child knows their rights and feels empowered enough to speak up against any form of exploitation or abuse. The act recognizes the unique vulnerability of children and provides stringent punishment for offenders. This acts as a deterrent for potential perpetrators and sends a strong message that child sexual abuse will not be tolerated. Furthermore, the POCSO Act has helped raise awareness about the issue of child sexual abuse in India. It has encouraged parents, teachers and other stakeholders to take proactive measures to protect children from such crimes. It ensures that children are not subjected to any form of sexual abuse or exploitation, which can have severe long-term effects on their lives. In addition to legal protection, the POCSO Act also raises awareness about child sexual abuse and encourages reporting of such incidents. It empowers children by giving them a voice against their abusers and promoting a safe environment for them. I invite all heads of educational institutions come under the management of Catholic Educational Society of Udupi Diocese (CESU), Udupi to use this Child Protection Policy (this hand book) and provide every child a safe haven in our campuses.

Preface

When we possess knowledge that can benefit others in their personal or professional lives, it is better to share it with them. By doing so, we can help them accomplish their tasks more effectively. As an educator, after going through the Education Act of Karnataka and its associated rules, I have taken the initiative to share this information with others. A small effort has been made to provide additional insights, enabling the readers to work efficiently and avoid common mistakes.

The Karnataka Education Act of 1983 is an important law in Karnataka that set the rules for the State's education system. It covered almost all the provisions of primary to higher secondary education providing some glimpses into Higher Education too. The Act and rules made thereunder make provisions for the government to offer mandatorily free and compulsory education to all children up to a certain age. They also establish a standard curriculum and assessment system to ensure consistent education nationwide. They focus on improving the quality of education by setting criteria for school facilities, teacher qualifications, and other important aspects. They also give guidelines for how schools should be affiliated and recognized to ensure they meet certain standards. As a whole, the Education Act of 1983 and the rules made thereunder aim to make education more accessible, improve its quality, and set clear rules for its governance in Karnataka.

The manual introduces the Karnataka Education Act and provides its relevance. Further, it speaks about the rules for private tuition, safety, curriculum, and parent involvement. It also discusses free and mandatory education, the RTE Act of 2009, examination board guidelines, school registration, and updates. Other topics include school management, fees, the takeover of schools by the government, student development, admission procedures, private school regulation, inspections, and officers' roles. In addition to that it talks about registration of tutorial institutions, rules within schools, tobacco sales near schools, record-keeping, role of employees, staff conditions, pre-university education in Karnataka, higher education councils, part-time lecturer absorption, education department rules, affiliation certificates, Kannada language policy, provisions for minorities, and some other essential details.

Thus, this manual contains some basic information but it will surely assist the educationists or stakeholders of the education field to get themselves empowered with some additional knowledge. Certainly, readers consulting the manual should keep themselves informed of the circulars and notifications issued by the Department/Competent Authority/State over time.
