Later the society was established in India in 1889 at Nagpur through the leadership of Mother Marie Gertrude our Co-foundress. The Society began to grow and spread across Pan India.

In Karnataka the society came into existence in 1914 and the ministry of education became a registered society under the Mysore Societies' Registration Act 1960. "The Mary Salian Society" as per the Memorandum with its head office located in Chamarajpet, Bangalore-18. The Society's inception was dated 19/07/1965 order No: 63/1965-1966, registered under the Mysore Societies' Registration Act 1960. (Mysore Act No.17 of 1960).

We have both Aided and Unaided educational Institutions that come under the management and administration of "The Mary Salian Society". We work in urban and rural areas of Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh. The Society has both English and Kannada medium schools; Our primary goal is to empower the girl child and women where ever we render our services. In some places we also have co-education schools.
